Consecration Sunday Is Here!

Beginning in 2013, Kirk of Our Savior began utilizing the *New Consecration Sunday* Stewardship Program as a method by which we would articulate the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our emphasis of stewardship education.

This program is based upon the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Rather than treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we instead treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who naturally want to give as an act of discipleship.

For obvious reasons, the past two years of our stewardship program have not resembled the previous seven nearly as much as we would have liked...the pandemic's twists and turns have impacted everything and this is no exception. One constant in the midst of everything, however, has been the *commitment of Jesus Christ to all of us*. Our savior has never stopped walking with us, never stopped loving us and never stopped sustaining us in our time of need. As such – knowing that God has already given us all we could ever hope for in the form of the saving Messiah – we faithfully ask the same question we *have* asked the previous seven years: "What is God calling me to give?"

The most important part of this question has absolutely nothing to do with money. And no: I am not trying to be clever here.

None of what we contribute financially at our church matters if our hearts do not desire to give joyfully as we have received. It is an empty action. It does not help **you** at all, and that is the biggest reason we have our stewardship program in place: to facilitate discipleship for our church members....to assist as best we can in helping all of our Kirk family to grow in relationship with the Lord by utilizing our God-given resources as *faithfully* as we possibly can. Our program is not about "paying the church's bills." It's about growing in our faith with the acknowledgement that all we have – time, talent, resources – is a gift and comes only from God. It's about spiritual growth for all of us that cannot possibly take place if we cling to earthly resources while placing trust in ourselves instead of God.

The church's mission obviously matters. *But so do you*. There is no reason that we cannot continue our individual and collective spiritual development while simultaneously supporting our church's mission to the local community and the world. And I will be so bold as to inform everyone that even in the midst of these past two years *our mission has only grown*. Your contributions have had a tremendous impact upon children as near as Wayne and Westland but also as far away as South Africa. We have been blessed with opportunities to help people and you all should be proud of that which you are such an integral part.

During morning worship on November 14, 2021 (Consecration Sunday), we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's ministries in this community and around the world. We will have a brief period of instruction and inspiration, culminating in members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

Thank you for your continued commitment both to your individual and also our collective congregational spiritual development as we all seek to grow in relationship with the Lord. The impact of our growth in these areas does not just benefit us personally, but stands also to touch the lives of so, so many others. Only by and through God's grace have we been put into this amazing position and I pray we never take that for granted.



So many kindnesses from friends, family and neighbors have carried me through the past years. Thanks to my special friends at the Kirk—God Bless.










October was a very busy and exciting month at Learn Through Play Preschool.
