June was the largest monthly net loss of the year, primarily due to being a three pay period month but also the first month of 2017 in which we had very limited building use funds as WCCP was on Summer Break. In addition, we replaced many light bulbs in the Fellowship Hall at a cost of a little less than \$325. Lately our summer months have included building expenses for catch up projects as well as capital costs for needed repairs and improvements.
